For a length of time now, the state board has been working on ways to improve and increase the membership of our state society. To that end, the board has created a committee (YEC- Young Engineers Committee) to oversee that effort.

A few of the goals are:

- 1) Increase the awareness NSPE-WI in engineering schools of WI.
- 2) Increase the number of student and young engineers in our State Society.
- 3) Increase awareness of the importance of PE licensure in engineering firms and firms with an engineering department.
- 4) Update and correct the mailing addresses of our state membership, welcome new and renewed members and remind those whose membership is about to expire to rejoin NSPE.
- 5) Improve the communications between our state board, chapter boards and state members as a whole to include the maintaining of current and accurate website information.
- 6) Increase the interest in our state society of its members through more affordable, higher quality, increased frequency and improved access of a diverse offering of professional development hour presentations as well as providing regular current updates of relevant activities. We are also offering full or partial membership dues compensation for chapter board members (up to five per chapter).

We have been implementing these changes over the last few years and we are just now starting to notice some improvement in our membership:

- 1) All of our chapters are active, which was not the case only a couple of years ago. Three years ago, we had 5 out of 7 inactive chapters!
- 2) We had no chapter participation in our state board. We now have two chapters represented at our monthly state board meetings.
- 3) Our state membership has been declining every year but now seems to be stabilizing at about 340+ members.
- 4) We had few or no student members, our student membership now seems to be increasing.

This event is scheduled to take place on Tuesday November 1st, 2022, between 10am-12pm central time. The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), **Region 5 (Wisconsin)** invites you to join a two-hour security webinar to enhance your organization's resilience in case of an active shooter incident.

Preparing employees for a potential active shooter event is an integral component of an organization's incident response planning. Because active shooter incidents are unpredictable and evolve quickly, preparing for and knowing what to do in an active shooter situation can be the difference between life and death. Every second counts.

Objectives:

- Provide information about best practices, communications protocols, and resources that will assist stakeholders to develop or enhance their emergency planning, preparedness, and response to active shooter incidents.
- Discuss the elements of active shooter incident response planning with guidance from expert instructors.
- Describe common behaviors, conditions, and situations associated with active shooter events.
- Discuss how to recognize potential workplace violence indicators.

Understanding Liability and Risk Exposure:

The webinar focuses on providing awareness training that supports the development of emergency action planning capabilities. These capabilities may better position organizations in receiving important legal liability protections from the DHS Support Anti-Terrorism by Fostering Effective Technologies (SAFETY) Act of 2002.
