

In September, we were invited and attended a presentation in Madison by Po-Shen Lo titled, "Math, Invention, & Life." Po is a professor at Carnegie Mellon University, serves as the national coach for the USA International Mathematical Olympiad, and is the founder at Daily Challenge (just to name a few of his

accomplishments in addition to being a member of the Hertz Foundation). Po's hometown is Madison, Wisconsin, where he was also a Jefferson Middle School MATHCOUNTS alumnus. Po spent his summer giving Public Math Talks where he visited over 40 cities in seven weeks motivating students. Po promoted MATHCOUNTS for our local chapter and encouraged participation in the event.

Another event in September was the annual ASIS/ASSE/WSPE Golf Outing that was held at the Bridges Golf Course in Madison. The event was well-attended and continues to be a great time with great weather!

In October, we participated in a Behind-the-Scenes Security and Safety Tour of the Henry Vilas Zoo in Madison. Attendees learned about the complications involved with keeping humans, lions, tigers, and bears in a safe environment. In November, an Active Shooter Webinar Presentation coordinated by Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), Region 5 (Wisconsin) CISA was offered to NSPE-WI. The purpose of the two-hour security webinar was to enhance your organization's resilience in case of an active shooter incident.



Objectives of the webinar were:

- Provide information about best practice communication protocols and resources that will assist stakeholders to develop or enhance their emergency planning, preparedness, and response to active shooter incidents.
- Discuss the elements of active shooter incident response planning with guidance from expert instructors.
- Describe common behaviors, conditions, and situations associated with active shooter events.
- Discuss how to recognize potential workplace violence indicators.

The Engineers Foundation of Wisconsin (EFW) scholarship application period was open through December 19, 2022. Our chapter will be busy reviewing applications and interviewing candidates so that we can award the scholarships during Engineers Week 2023.

Our chapter continues coordination and fundraising efforts for our local MATHCOUNTS competition scheduled for February 4. The competition will be held at Kromrey Middle School in Middleton, Wisconsin.

In September, we toured the new Wausau Drinking Water Treatment Facility. Work started on the new \$41 million facility in June 2020 and was substantially completed in early October 2022. Prior to full operation, approximately two months of testing needed to be completed to ensure the dozens of processes could operate without issue for several days to show proof of successful operation. Once each of the processes is proven to meet the design specifications, the utility staff needed to be trained on the process operation. Only then, did the WDNR approve the new facility for operation.
