A year ago, the plan was to hold several practice sessions through mid-January and then hold two virtual February competitions followed by a virtual State competition and then an in-person competition in May. For 2022, the process may be somewhat different although the virtual competition in February will likely be much the same as 2021.

As of this writing, NSPE-WI MATHCOUNTS coordinators are working together to again have a solidified plan as was done in 2021. Similar awards were presented among all participating chapters for the regional and state competition and coaches will be recognized with door prizes sponsored by local and professional sports teams.

For the virtual competition, only the Sprint and Target rounds will be given, and competitors are to be on their honor to obey competition rules.

Advancing rules have not yet been publicized, but since the regional competition is again virtual, one might expect similar rules to apply; about 10% advanced from regional to the State competition in 2021.

Regardless, I'm sure that the 2022 MATHCOUNTS competitions will be successful, and all competitors will have a great time!

## 2022 Engineers' Week Celebration

As you may recall, last year NSPE-WI held its first virtual Engineers' Week Celebration, and I'm guessing that we may do the same thing for 2022. If in-person, each chapter would likely make their own decision to hold or not hold an E-Week dinner but the State could also hold a virtual celebration as well.

Engineers Week will be celebrated from February 20-26. The exact date that a virtual celebration would be held has yet to be determined. Last year's virtual celebration included 1) reading of the Governor's proclamation of Engineers' Week, 2) recognition of all chapters making scholarship donations and the respective recipients of them, 3) recognition of Chapter and State award recipients and 4) a special update by Phil O'Leary of how many of the former scholarship recipients were doing in their engineering career.

All in all, the 2021 virtual EW celebration was very successful and hopefully WSPE will again hold a virtual Engineers' Week celebration for all chapters to attend.

## 2022 Discovery Conference

The WSPE Discovery Conference committee has been planning the 2022 conference since August. This year we plan to make a few larger changes. Perhaps the most significant change is that in 2022, we will be holding BOTH a virtual AND an in-person conference. The virtual portion will again be for 7 weeks – March 8 through April 21 – comprised of two presentations per week (Tuesday and Thursday @ 12 pm noon). Each presentation will last 60 minutes (including Q&A) but a few presentations will last for 90 minutes. The total number of PDHs for the virtual portion will be 16 while the in-person conference will offer 4 PDHs.

The in-person portion will be held on Friday, October 14, from 11:30 am until 5:00 pm and will include a sit-down lunch, a 60-90 minute presentation, a 2-hour field trip and a social function after the conclusion of the field trip at 5:00 pm. The field trip will be at the Brown County Expo Center, and the social function will also be held at the Brown County Expo Center after the field trip conclusion. Holding the event on a Friday afternoon offers the opportunity for some to drive up to Green Bay on Friday morning and also offers the opportunity to spend more time in Green Bay (at their own expense). Whether for 1 day or the weekend, attending this function offers a great opportunity to see the fall colors in northern Wisconsin next fall (and of course, there are a lot of fun things to do in Green Bay!).

Our theme for 2022 is “Today’s Technology Transforming Tomorrow’s World”. We will look at technologies of diverse engineering disciplines to get a glimpse of how these technologies are and will continue to shape our world of tomorrow. Technologies such as electric cars, their batteries and charging station infrastructure requirements, new 3D printing capabilities and some of the new ways they’re now being utilized, smart magnets that are used in modern manufacturing plants and other interesting applications, civil engineering projects and the technologies used to fabricate them, unique fluid dynamics applications to address the covid-19 virus and much more!

Registration prices for the virtual conference will be the same as last year (\$150 for all 14 presentations) with individual presentation options (there will be an extra charge for the in-person conference).
