EFW – ENGINEERS FOUNDATION OF WISCONSIN PURPOSE

Organized in 1982, **EFW** (Engineers Foundation of Wisconsin) provides support and recognition for outstanding high school or college students pursuing engineering as a professional career.

EFW's overall goal is to provide scholarships, promote engineering education, and conduct educational programs which benefit both the public and the engineering profession.

BACKGROUND

EFW is dedicated to promoting and supporting engineering education and its social and economic influence vital to the quality of life.

With this in mind, EFW was established as a way to encourage outstanding Wisconsin scholars pursuing careers in engineering.

SUPPORT

A tax-exempt corporation, EFW is funded by contributions from members of the state (WSPE) and national (NSPE) societies of professional engineers; and from businesses, individuals, endowments, trusts, bequests, and other planned giving.

MANAGEMENT

The Foundation is managed by a nine-member board of trustees, all of whom are members of the Wisconsin Society of Professional Engineers (WSPE).

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Since its inception in 1982, EFW has given over \$150,000 in scholarships to over 200 students pursuing a career in engineering.

AN OVERVIEW

The Engineers Foundation of Wisconsin offers annual scholarships. The moneys for these scholarships come from contributions from individuals and corporations in the engineering community and earnings from EFW investments.
